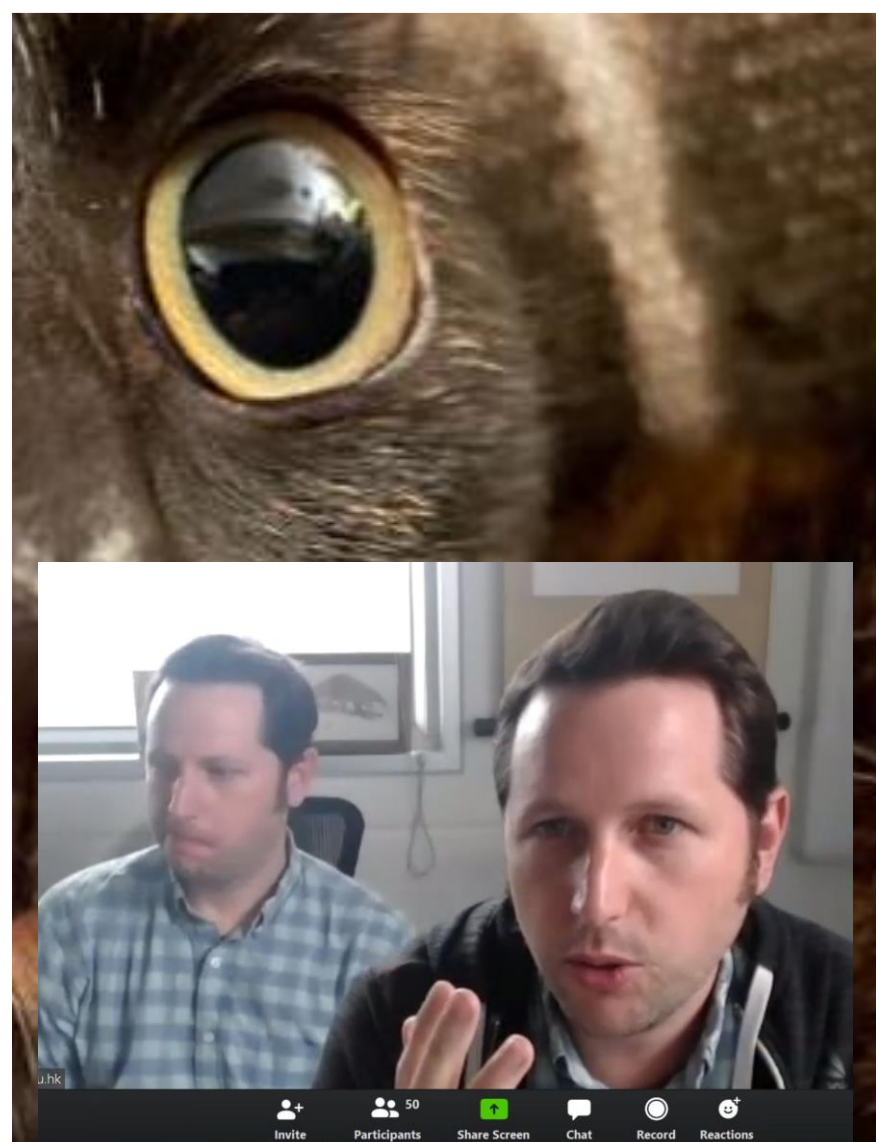


Teaching and Learning in Ecology and Biodiversity
